### Day 1 Chihuahua

In the morning we will visit the municipal slaughterhouse where we will take a guided tour that explains how the cattle is kept and prepared for slaughter and see the instruments and utensils used to kill it. 1 hour approximately

We will then travel to Aldama, a 20-minute drive approximately, where we will visit Sotol Coyamito a family brewery where this alcohol is produced in a traditional manner. Sotol is considered a sister-drink of tequila and is very typical of the state of Chihuahua. 2 hours approximately

In the afternoon we will return to Chihuahua city where we will have lunch at Quintal one of the most known meat restaurants of the Capital.

After our meal we will visit the cathedral, aqueduct, the murals of the government palace and the Pancho Villa Museum. 4 hours approximately

Overnight stay in Chihuahua

### Day 2 Cuauhtémoc-Creel

Early in the morning we will start our journey to Ciudad Cuauhtemoc 1 hour 20 minutes approximately in order to visit La Norteña the largest apple producer in Mexico and also very active on the international market. We will visit the apple orchards and will observe the different production process that the company has. 1 hour approximately

From here we will go to the Mennonite museum in order to learn all about the history and customs of this fascinating community. 40 minutes approximately

We will have lunch at Casa Doña Carolina a restaurant located right in the middle of an apple orchard. We will taste several dishes where apples are the main ingredient.

After our meal, we will start our journey towards Creel where we will spend the night. This will be a 2 hour 30 minute drive approximately

### Day 3 Creel-Divisadero Barrancas

In the morning we will prepare a traditional Mennonite pizza and a discada with some of the best cuts of meat. The discada plow disk cooking is traditional to Chihuahua. This will be done at the Best Western Lodge in Creel. 2 hours approximately

We will then start our journey to Divisadero Barrancas, a 1-hour drive approximately. During the trip we will visit the valley of mushrooms and the valley of frogs where a Raramuri community lives. We will also see the spectacular Arareko Lake. 40 minutes approximately

When we arrive at Divisadero we will have a “Kodak moment”. For 15-minutes you will be able to snap away and capture the magnificent and breathtaking beauty of the 7 canyons of Chihuahua.

We will then go to either of two hotels: Divisadero Barrancas or Hotel Mansión Tarahumara where we will taste some of the gastronomical delights of the raramuri community such as: tonari, a meat broth made with spices of the area, tamales, chacales tender corncobs and tortillas. We will also taste tesgüino a fermented drink made from corn. Besides tasting these regional specialties we will enjoy a show of community dancing. 2 hours approximately

End of tour

Depending on your final destination you can return to Chihuahua on the Chepe Train. If you are returning to Chihuahua the train leaves the Posada station at 13:46 and if you are continuing your trip towards Los Mochis, Sinaloa the train leaves at 13:52. If you have more free time, we suggest you visit the third largest funicular railway in the world.

### Day 1 Chihuahua

### Day 2 Hidalgo de Parral

Early in the morning we will start our journey towards Hidalgo de Parral approximately a 2 hour-40 minute drive, where we will visit La Parralense bakery; we will learn how to prepare the traditional bread of this community. 1 1/2 hours approximately

We will then visit La Gota de Miel a typical candy store where we will be able to purchase some of the most delicious candies of the region. 30-minutes approximately.

In the afternoon we will visit Valle de Allende, a 2 hour 40 minute drive approximately, where we will visit a regional candy factory and see the preparation of typical candies such as: jamoncillo, a milk-based delicacy, ate de membrillo, a fruit paste made from quince, nut candy etc. 3 hours approximately

We will then return to Chihuahua for another overnight stay.

### Day 3 Cuahtémoc-Creel

Early in the morning we will start our journey to Ciudad Cuahtemoc 1 hour 20 minutes approximately in order to visit La Norteña the largest apple producer in Mexico and very active on the international market. We will visit the apple orchards and will observe the different production process that the company has. 1 hour approximately

From here we will go to the Mennonite museum in order to learn all about the history and customs of this fascinating community. 40 minutes approximately
