Day 1- Pachuca, Actopan, Santiago de Anaya, Ixmiquilpan

We will start our tour visiting Pachuca's gastronomical corridor where you will be able to taste pastes (a type of Cornish pastries), barbacoa slow cooked mutton and other typical dishes of the area. 1 ½ hours approximately

Our next activity will be a cultural tour where we will visit the monumental clock; the Royal Safe building where the fifth of the King was kept and the Victoria de los Vientos. 2hours approximately

Our next visit will be to the famous rehilte (pinwheel) museum. 2 hours approximately.

We will then leave for the 30minute trip to Actopan where we will visit the caves and natural springs of Tolantongo. Here you will be able to participate in a number of cave, river and cascade activities. 5 hours approximately

After our sports interlude we will go to the Municipality of Santiago de Anaya where we will visit Morelos market. This market offers an incredible variety of gastronomical delights and more interestingly the craftsmen here are dedicated to a very particular art: they make fireworks and crafts with the fiber of the maguey. 2 hours approximately

Another important culinary activity in the Mezquital region consists of delicious pre-Columbian dishes made of insects.

We suggest you eat at one of the restaurants serving barbacoa (slow-cooked mutton in a ground oven).

Overnight stay in Ixmiquilpan

Day 2- Ixmiquilpan, Real del Monte, Huasca de Campo

We start our day with a very interesting visit to Xoxafi caves where an incredible eco-tourism experience awaits us. 3hours

From there we will travel to the Magic Town of Real del Monte. Here we will visit the town's principal mining monuments. Real del Monte was once inhabited by Cornish miners 2 ½ hours approximately

Our next stop will be a visit to the Centro de Produccion Psicicola San Miguel Regal (a trout farm) where we will catch our Rainbow trout for lunch. 2 ½ hours approximately

Another planned activity is a visit to the basalt poles in Huasca de Ocampo

The afternoon will be spent discovering Chico National Park.

Overnight stay in Chico National Park

Day 3- Zempoala , Tepeapulco

An hour's drive from Mineral del Chico and we arrive at the Hacienda of San Juan Pueblilla in Zempoala where we will see the preparation of artisanal beer. 1½ hours

Later on we will participate in a cultural tour where we will visit the churches of the neighborhood of Zempoala and Huacuala, the aqueduct of Tembleque, built by Jesuits and the Rollo of Zempoala-a stone column topped with stone carvings of insignias used to mark jurisdiction. A visit to the old and almost destroyed dam La Compuerta is also programmed. 3 ½ hours

In the afternoon we will go to Tepeapulco to visit Hacienda San Antonio Tochatlaco one of the last still producing pulque-a fermented agave drink. 2 hour visit approximately

We will finish this tour by visiting the National Museum of Pulque and Maguey 1hour visit approximately

Day 1- Pachuca

We will start our tour visiting Pachuca's gastronomical corridor where you will be able to taste pastes (a type of Cornish pastries), barbacoa slow cooked mutton and other typical dishes of the area. 1 ½ hours approximately

Our next activity will be a cultural tour where we will visit among other things, the monumental clock, the Royal Safe building where the fifth of the King was kept and the Victoria de los Vientos. 2 hours approximately

Our next visit will be to the famous rehilte-pinwheel museum. 2 hours approximately

Overnight stay in Pachuca

Day 2- Actopan, Santiago de Anaya, Ixmiquilpan

We will then leave for the 30minute trip to Actopan where we will visit the caves and natural springs of Tolantongo. Here you will be able to participate in a number of cave, river and cascade activities. 5 hours approximately

After our sports interlude we will go to the Municipality of Santiago de Anaya where we will visit Morelos market. This market offers an incredible variety of gastronomical delights and more interestingly the craftsmen are dedicated to a very particular art: they make fireworks and crafts with the fiber of the maguey. 2 hours approximately

Overnight stay in Ixmiquilpan

Day 3– Real del Monte, Huasca de Campo

We will start our day by travelling to the Magic Town of Real del Monte. Here we will visit the town's principal mining monuments. Real del Monte was once inhabited by Cornish miners 2 ½ hours approximately

Our next stop will be a visit to Centro de Produccion Psicicola San Miguel Regal (a trout farm) where we will catch our Rainbow trout for lunch. 2 ½ hours approximately

Another planned activity is a visit to the basalt poles in Huasca de Ocampo

The afternoon will be spent discovering Chico National Park.

Day 4- Zempoala , Tepeapulco

Only an hour away from Mineral del Chico we will stop at Hacienda of San Juan Pueblilla in Zempoala where we will see the way they make artisanal beer. 1½ hours

Later on we will participate in a cultural tour where we will visit the churches of the neighborhood of Zempoala and Huacualla, the aqueduct of Tembleque, built by Jesuits and the Rollo of Zempoala-a stone column topped with stone carvings of insignias used to mark jurisdiction. A visit to the old and almost destroyed dam La Compuerta is also programmed. 3 ½ hours

In the afternoon we will go to Tepeapulco to visit Hacienda San Antonio Tochatlaco one of the last haciendas still producing pulque, a fermented agave drink. 2 hours approximately

Day 5- Tepeapulco

For our last stop in Hidalgo we will go to Xihuingo Toltec archeological ruins. We will climb the nearby hill in order to see the varied fauna of the place. 3 hours approximately

Later on, as our last activity we will visit the National Museum of Pulque and Maguey. 1 hour visit approximately
